Straddling the Equator, Borneo is the world's third largest island and home to an amazing diversity of flora, fauna and indigenous cultures. In this audio-visual presentation Jodi will feature Kuching with its ancient temples and colorful markets, displaying the jungle products that first brought traders to Borneo; long boat trips to the native Iban, former head hunters, in their traditional long houses in the rainforest; and Borneo's endangered wildlife, including rare proboscis monkeys, found only in Borneo, and orangutans in their natural habitat.

From the west, take the Post Road across the Saugatuck River and Myrtle Ave. is the fourth left (Church Lane is one way!).
